




EARLY YEARS TOUR

Grab a coffee in one of Dayton's historic districts you're going to need it for this packed itinerary!

- Start in downtown Dayton at the Dayton Aviation Heritage National Historical Park to see how the Wright brothers got their start, learn about their cycling business, and explore their stories.
- Continue your journey to Huffman Prairie Flying Field and Interpretive Center to walk the field where the first practical airplane was invented.
- Carillon Park is your next stop to both view that first practical airplane, but also to grab lunch in the park's brewery or café.
- After you've explored all 65 acres of the museum, head to the Wright "B" Flyer and experience a flight yourself. Or, visit the Wright State University Archives to read the Wrights' diaries and letters.
- To finish out your trip, Woodland Cemetery & Arboretum provides beautiful views over Dayton's skyline from the Wright brothers' final resting place. Located near the University of Dayton and a variety of restaurants, a top pick is The Pine Club: a Dayton icon and a top ranked steakhouse throughout the



Cincinnati

Cincinnati is less than an hour away from the National Aviation Heritage Area. Shine in the neon glow of the American Sign Museum and stop into Jungle Jim's International Market on your way for a truly unique culinary experience.

Columbus

Columbus, the nation's third largest fashion capital, is only an hour away from the National Aviation Heritage Area. Visits to COSI science center and the Columbus Zoo are a must for all traveling families.

Indianapolis

We don't recommend you drive quite as fast as the Indy 500 racers, but Indianapolis is just two hours away from the National Aviation Heritage Area. Visit the Indianapolis Motor Speedway for track and behind-the-scenes tours.

Detroit

MotorCities National Heritage Area in Detroit is less than three hours away from the National Aviation Heritage Area. Key stops are The Henry Ford Museum and the North American International Auto Show. Step foot in the lab where Thomas Edison had his lightbulb moment, in the Bagley Avenue shed re-created by Henry Ford to share the story of where he built his first car, and in the bicycle workshop where the Wright brothers taught us to reach for the sky.



- Start your day with the world's oldest military aviation museum, the National Museum of the United States Air Force. Plan on spending at least half a day exploring four hangers from Early Years to the Space Age. Try your skills on a flight simulator, view hundreds of planes, and be inspired to lead the next chapters of aerospace innovation. While you're there, make sure to stop into the National Aviation Hall of Fame to learn about the people that changed the course of our aviation history
- Find a delicious lunch in historic Downtown Troy, famous for its architecture and annual Strawberry Festival. You'll be in the hometown of Historic WACO Field and can stop into the museum for a tour or a ride in an open-cockpit biplane for a truly unique view of the city.
- Your next stop is in Urbana at Historic Grimes Field. Help to restore a B-17 "Flying Fortress" or sit for dinner at the airport and watch planes as you sample their homemade pie.

*Insider Tip: Whether you are doing one itinerary, or multiple, extend your stay in a historic hotel in Urbana. Visit the nearby Freshwater Farms Sturgeon Petting Zoo, Ohio Caverns, or Cedar Bog Nature Preserve.

- Looking for a way to go to the moon? It may happen sooner than you think, so better go prepared. Make your first stop the Armstrong Air & Space Museum in Neil Armstrong's hometown of Wapakoneta. Marvel at the building's unique architecture before stepping inside, and leave plenty of time to watch the historic film footage.
- Have lunch in a quaint downtown restaurant before heading to the Airstream Factory Tour Jackson Center. Not only are their 'Silver Bullet' RVs known for their unique design, but they were also used as decontamination units for the returning Apollo 11 astronauts.
- Head south to Dayton to continue your space adventure at Charles Bassett II's mural next to Warped Wing Brewery. Grab tickets (if you can) to a Dayton Dragons baseball game on the banks of the Great Miami River and watch the Fountain of Lights, one of the world's largest fountains, in action at RiverScape MetroPark.

*Insider Tip: Airstream isn't the only camper-friendly attraction. Bring your own RV or tent to stay at nearby Grand Lake St. Marys State Park.

ARMSTRONG AIR & SPACE MUSEUM

The Armstrong Air & Space Museum, named for Wapakoneta's own Neil Armstrong, exhibits a combination of aviation and aerospace collections and artifacts from the first man to walk on the moon.

The Apollo 11 crew had completed the greatest journey in human history: putting men on the moon and setting the course for the future of the nation's space program. The impact of that journey is still felt in Wapakoneta today. Businesses and streets in the community reflect the pride the city has in its native son, the first person to walk on the moon.



WRIGHT STATE UNIVERSITY WRIGHT ARCHIVES

The Wright Brothers Collection, housed in Special Collections and Archives in the Wright State University Libraries, is one of the most complete collections of Wright material in the world.

The library includes the Wrights' own technical and personal library, family papers including letters, diaries, financial records, genealogical files, and other documents detailing the lives and work of Wilbur and Orville Wright and the Wright Family. It also includes awards, certificates, medals, albums, recordings, and technical drawings. Perhaps the most valuable part of the collection are the thousands of photographs documenting the invention of the airplane and the lives of the Wright family.



HISTORIC GRIMES FIELD

t the Champaign Aviation Museum, you'll get a close-up look at historic aircraft—particularly from World War II—that soared to great heights to preserve freedom. More than stationary museum pieces, these warbirds have been or are being restored to fly again.

And, shed new light on your appreciation for aircraft lighting and learn more about the man who was dedicated to making flight safer at night by visiting the Grimes Flying Laboratory museum. Warren G. Grimes, an enshrinee of the National Aviation Hall of Fame, produced his first airplane lights in his garage in 1933. By World War II, Grimes Manufacturing Company had grown to produce lighting for the needs of military aviation.

*Insider Tip: the Grimes Airport Cafe is known for their homemade pie. Enjoy a slice on their patio watching planes take off and



WOODLAND CEMETERY & ARBORETUM

Pounded in 1841, Woodland Cemetery is one of the nation's oldest rural garden cemeteries and is a unique cultural, botanical, and educational resource in the heart of Dayton.

Thousands tour the beautifully landscaped grounds each year to visit the grave sites of Wilbur and Orville Wright and other members of the Wright family, poet Paul Laurence Dunbar, Governor James M. Cox, writer Erma Bombeck, inventor Charles F. Kettering and entrepreneurs John H. Patterson (NCR), George P. Huffman (Huffy Bicycles), George H. Mead (Mead Paper), Loren M. Berry, Sr. (L. M. Berry Co.), Preserved Smith (Barney & Smith Mfg. Co.), and the other 110,000 souls resting peacefully at Woodland.
